WHEREAS, the issues of higher education, public education, economic development, transportation, health care, tourism and border security are of the utmost importance to our communities in Cameron County; and


WHEREAS, Cameron County Commissioner's Court is committed to collaboration and partnerships with the City of Harlingen to continue moving projects and initiatives forward; and


